Road safety

Over the past few weeks I have been becoming increasingly alarmed at the end of the day when children are walking out of school to go home.

While I have been out I have seen several parents waiting for their children on the opposite side of the road to collect children - that is fine. My concern is that I have seen those parents direct the children to cross from the opposite side of the road while ten metres down we have a patrol set up to cross your children safely **on the road crossing**. This is very alarming and extremely dangerous - my question to the parents who are doing this is - What are you teaching your children? Please take the time to get out of your car and wait for your children by the crossing on the other side of the road, this way we are teaching them how to cross safely and still allowing them their independence to meet you out of school.

Equally alarming is the amount of children walking to the church car park to find their parents' car. There is no issue with your children having independence and being able to meet you outside the school (we encouraged this after COVID as we could see how it was growing our children). My concern is that the church car park is a danger zone with cars entering and leaving, children are so busy looking for their car they are not paying attention to anything else! Please if you are picking your child from the car park, get out of your car and walk over to the fence where you can see your child leaving the school grounds and be there to guide them.

From early on as teachers we learn about Vygotsky's Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD). The proximal refers to skills the child is close to gaining but not quite there yet - they still need a certain amount of scaffolding, like training wheels on a bike. I guess if you relate crossing the road or finding their car to ZPD for many of our children they are getting there but still need some guidance to stay safe and learn in a scaffolded way.

We want all our children to stay safe and learn good safety skills and it's our job together to make sure it happens

Lost property - please name your child's clothes

The lost property went out on Friday and some got back to the rightful owners. Please make sure that you name **all** the clothing your child wears at school (including underwear -

swimming is starting soon!) It makes it so much easier to get items back to the correct person if it is named.

Can you please also make sure that if your child comes home with items that do not belong to them you bring them back to school.

The days are getting warmer

Sun hats, sun block and wearing appropriate clothing will protect your child. Please make sure they come prepared for sunny weather
