Principal's voice:

Tēnā koutou, talofa, bonjour, malo e lelei, kia orana and hello,

I hope this newsletter finds you well and not too stressed coming up to the holiday season! This is one of the busiest times for us at school with many extras to fit in! The teachers are working hard to get reports to Anne- Marie and I to read. The reports will be with you on 15th December.
