Principal's voice:

Tēnā koutou, talofa, bonjour, malo e lelei, kia orana and hello,

As the children arrived at school after such a long time away it lightened my heart, there was anxiousness, shyness, excitement and even though many wore masks I could see smiles and delight at returning! How lucky are we to have your children in our lives!

It is hard to believe we are very close to the end of the year and once again we find ourselves in a very strange place! This has been an incredibly hard year for us all. Hopefully next year will bring a more settled year of learning for our tamariki with opportunities and experiences to explore, develop and learn!

For me personally it has been an exciting year for my growth and development, I was fortunate to be given the opportunity to work with The Springboard Trust. The Strategic Leadership for Principals Programme (SLPP) brings New Zealand principals together with strategic experts, leaders in the business world, to develop leadership and to support clear, insightful planning for schools. This has been so beneficial as strategic leadership is a pivotal element for improved school performance. Over a series of workshops spanning 10 months, SLPP explored the core elements of strategic leadership. This has aided so much in working through our school charter for the next three years.

Things will look a little different next year.

Being a small school comes with its challenges! And when we have a school with many elements it becomes even more so. With zoning now in the mix we have had some difficult choices to make. Next year will look a little different but there is some great professional development happening that I hope will excite you as much as it does me.

We will have 7 classes next year:

Room 5 - year 5 and 6

Room 6 - year 4, 5 and 6

Room 7 - year 3 and 4

Room 8 (EDN) - year 3 (3 children), 4, 5 and 6

Room 9 (EDN) - year 1, 2 and 3

Room 10 - year 1 and 2

Room 11 - year 2 and 3

We will make sure children know what class they will be in before the end of the year.

With only a few children in Ngā Muka unfortunately it is not sustainable to continue as a whanau class but we want to make sure that as a whole school we are moving forward in terms of Tikanga Māori and Te reo Māori.

Our PD is focussing on Tikanga Māori and Te Reo Māori for the whole school. We are committed as a school and have booked Whakamānawatia te Reo Māori Programme. Whakamānawatia te reo Māori is all about supporting our kura with long term teacher development and a sustainable te ao Māori programme that progresses tamariki and kaiako through their learning year by year.

The programme has three elements which incorporate learning for our teachers, learning for our students and learning for our community if you are interested or would like to take part:

 Reo Kura (school) consists of weekly online 30 minute lessons covering te reo Māori, tikanga and te ao Māori.

- Reo Kaiako (teachers) is professional development for teachers which includes ongoing weekly support.
- Reo Whānau (family) is ongoing weekly learning sessions for families of our tamariki in our kura (school)

A thank you to staff who are moving on or leaving:

We would like to acknowledge our staff who will be leaving us at the end of the term:

- Anne-Sophie Carlon has been with us for two years. Anne-Sophie came from Lile in France for a two year secondment as part of her professional development.
